**Capital Improvements Update**—Thanks to capital donations in the last couple of years, we have several large projects completed and a few more in the works! The remaining section of the roof was resurfaced at the end of last year and the parking lot was repaved this Spring. Minisplit HVAC units were installed in Fr. Stace's office, the library, commons, and nursery in April. Plumbing lines were repaired on the South side of the church. A design committee is planning much needed updates to the sacristy and vesting areas as well as remodeling the commons and kitchen area. We are also hoping to refresh the Nave and make some lighting improvements.
